After a busy 193rd Legislative Session, I am excited to be in your inbox again to share some exciting updates from the First Middlesex Senate District.

On September 30th, Senator Bruce Tarr and I hosted our second roundtable discussion regarding Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) in municipalities along the Merrimack River. This meeting followed a similar discussion in April, with stakeholders and elected officials from New Hampshire included in the September meeting. I am happy to report that the meeting was very productive and Senator Tarr and I are working on planning a third meeting in February.

There were many fun events throughout the district this month. The annual Lowell Celebrates Kerouac festival was October 10th through 14th and combined music, poetry, and tours of Lowell to celebrate the life and work of Lowell native and author Jack Kerouac. I had the honor of attending a commemorative event and speaking about my late friend, Thomas Mansour.

I also was the official starter for the <u>Lowell Kinetic Sculpture Race</u>, one of my favorite annual events in the First Middlesex Senate district. The race attracts entries from artists, engineers, performers, and visionaries by promoting the synthesis of the STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics) fields, disruptive innovation, and physical activity.

<u>Secretary of Veterans' Services</u> Jon Santiago spent two days in the First Middlesex Senate District. The meeting on the first day was in Pepperell and

the second day's meeting was at the Lowell VA clinic. The discussion included the recently passed HERO Act, medical services available to veterans, and other issues pertaining to veterans and their families.

The discussion focused on topics that included technological advances for detecting bacteria and the potential for federal funding to eliminate CSOs in the Merrimack River. Lowell Kinetic Sculpture Race



On September 21st, the streets of Downtown Lowell were blocked off for the annual Lowell Kinetic Sculpture Race.
Organized by Bianca Mauro and Michael Roundy, the Lowell Kinetic Sculpture race takes place on the third Saturday of September. Senator Kennedy has been the official starter for the STEAM event since its inception in 2016. This year's race drew a huge crowd at the starting line in Downtown Lowell and at the finish

line at Lowell Heritage State Park. A little rain didn't dampen the festivities.

Kinetic sculptures are human-powered, all-terrain amphibious vehicles made from new and repurposed materials and engineered to race over streets, water,

mud, and sand. The race seeks to energize artists, engineers, performers, and future innovators by championing the fusion of STEAM fields.

The annual race is open to all ages and works with students from local schools and after-school programs, artists, engineers, bike enthusiasts, and anyone with a spark of creativity and a sense of adventure. The Lowell Kinetic

Massachusetts Secretary of Veterans' Services, Jon Santiago, spent two days visiting the First Middlesex Senate District. On October 8th, he met with State Representative Margaret Scarsdale, Senator Kennedy's Chief of Staff, Patti Kirwin-Keilty, Chair of the Pepperell Select Board, Mark Matthews,

Veterans' Service Agents from surrounding towns, and other members of the Pepperell veteran community at the Pepperrell VFW post 3291 to discuss the HERO Act and other updates to veterans' services. On October 9th, Secretary Santiago toured the Lowell VA Clinic and concluded his visit with a roundtable discussion with the Lowell delegation and city officials. The discussion included the HERO Act, veteran homelessness, available medical services, and other legislative matters.

The HERO Act expands benefits for veterans, servicemen and women, and their families, and modernizes veterans' services, ensuring that Massachusetts is unrivaled among the states in providing care for its service members and veterans. Since 2016, Lowell has been one of three communities that have achieved a virtual zero regarding veteran homelessness. New Bedford and Lynn also have virtual zero.



On Wednesday, October 9th, Senator Kennedy attended an open house at the Lowell Community Justice Support Center. The visit included a tour of the facility and a description of the various services provided at the Center.

The Lowell Community Justice Support Center offers cognitive behavioral

treatment, education, career counseling, clinical case management, and community service opportunities. Courts can sentence those convicted of a crime to intensive supervision with treatment at a Support Center in lieu of a sentence to the Department of Correction or House of Correction.



Karen Frederick Retires from Community Teamwork



Senator Kennedy was honored to join hundreds of well-wishers at a retirement party for Karen Frederick on Thursday, October 24th. After twenty years as the Chief Executive Officer of Community Teamwork, Karen

Frederick will retire on November 1st. Community Teamwork serves 58 thousand people and has more than 36 programs and 600 employees. During Senator Kennedy's time as a City Councilor, Mayor, and State Senator, he had the pleasure of working with Karen on several different projects. Her impact on the Greater Lowell community has been immeasurable.

Vinfen's New Residential Program
